4.	How & when do I label my N95 mask?	Please don gloves. Label your N95 mask with your FIRST NAME, LAST NAME UNIT, and DATE OF FIRST USE with a permanent black marker while on you unit Label on the top left corner Unit = "MEE
5.	How & when do I label my clean bag?	Please label your clean bag with your FIRST NAME, LAST NAME, UNIT, with a permanent black marker while on your unit  Unit = "MEE"
6.	Where will the masks be processed?	The masks will be processed in the Central Sterile Processing (CSP) department
7.	Do I need to take my mask to CSP?	No. CSP will pick up masks on designated pick up units By 9am
8.	How long will the process take?	The process from pick up to return should take approximately 2-3 hours
9.	Do I need to do anything prior to placing my mask in the brown bag for pick up?	Yes! Before you place your mask in the brown bag to be picked up by CSP, you MUST do a visual inspection of your mask to check its integrity. If the mask has any of the following defects, it cannot go through the decontamination process:  Soiled Distorted in shape Holes Flaking/Shredding Missing/broken straps
10.	Where should I put the "dirty" brown bag when ready for pick up?	Place bag in designated red bin on the unit. One (1) mask per bag per person.
11.	How does the process work?	CSP will pick up red bin from designated units at listed times and return to units after processing
12.	How do I know this is my mask?	You would have labeled your mask and bag
	Is my mask sterile after this process?	No, it is not sterile. This is one of the decontamination processes that
	·	many hospitals are using during the COVID-19 pandemic
14.	How many times can I have my mask decontaminated by CSP in the Steris VPRO	CSP will be placing a tally mark ("I") on the mask for processing of <u>2</u> times. The mask will <u>NOT</u> be processed more than twice
